CULTURAL SIGNIFICANCE:

This tree is a species of Eucalyptus commonly planted in the late 1800s and early 1900s, but not within the Shire. This specimen is one of the few plantings from that time and is especially large and apparently in very good condition. It is located in the centre of the township and is also of streetscape and landscape importance.

DESCRIPTION:

A tall clean trunked tree with high spreading canopy. It is located in the centre of the township immediately adjacent to the road reserve.

CONSERVATION GUIDELINES:

Protect from development.
