#### HISTORY

William Lee Berryman, an engine driver, owned fenced land in Candover street in 1890-1 and in 1891-2 a six room brick building and a bathroom and wash house were built. Berryman lived in the house for some time, however in 1919-20 he rented it to John Stephen, a police sergeant. By 1920 the property was used as the Geelong West Police Station and John Stephen was still the Police Sergeant.

### DESCRIPTION

53 Candover Street was built in 1891-2. It is a single storey brick building set on a bluestone plinth, and with a hipped roof clad with slates. It is typical of the Late Victorian style which incorporated design features such as an asymmetrical front elevation, polychrome brickwork, projecting room with a bay window, a large window with narrow side lights and elaborate cast iron lace and columns. It has long double-hung windows with bluestone sills.

## SIGNIFICANCE

53 Candover is a typical Late Victorian brick residence with an excellent degree of integrity, although there are only a few of these in the municipality of Geelong West. It was built in 1891-2 for William Lee Berryman and was used as the Geelong West Police Station for some time in the twentieth century. It is of local significance.

#### POLICY/RECOMMENDATIONS

Reinstatement of an appropriate fence would greatly enhance the character of this property.
