External Integrity

Generally original.

Significance

Historically important for its associations with Arnot Tolley, whose eventual role as Chairman of the Myer Emporium Board was in a time of vigorous expansion of that firm into suburban centres: of State importance.

Architecturally, similar to the Harry Norris house design for G.J. Coles in Toorak, this house has the then fashionable Moderne styling perhaps as a sign of both men's involvement with the marketing of new trends in their stores: of potential regional importance.1

History

Emily C. Allen owned Crown Allotments 1-6, Section 10, in Maling Road.² She sold Allotments 5 and 6 to Henry J.T. Tymms, who had a dwelling built there in 1899.³ The brick dwelling was of Tymms, a civil servant, owned the eight rooms.4 property until 1908, when Herbert Samuel Belyea bought Cataraqui, as the property was then known. Belyea owned and occupied the house until the early 1920s. By 1925, Frank Menzies had purchased the property, living there until the early 1950s, when he bought Robert Menzies' residence at 26 Reid Street, Balwyn(q.v.). Subsequent occupants of Cataraqui included Dr. W.F. Brownell

Frank Gladstone Menzies, the son of J. Menzies the M.L.A. for Lowan at one time, and the brother of the Right Honourable Robert G. Menzies, was born January 3, 1892, at Ballarat. Educated at Grenville College, Ballarat, he studied Law at Melbourne University, gaining his LL.B. in 1920 and being admitted to practice in the same year. Frank Menzies became the Crown Solicitor of Victoria in 1926, a position held until 1956, when he retired. An expert on constitutional law, he was a director of many companies, including Australian Controls Ltd., General Credits Ltd., and Permewan Wright Ltd.4 Awarded the C.B.E. in 1951, Frank Menzies was Chairman of the Freedom from Hunger Campaign in Victoria and a member of the Monckton Commission on Rhodesia Nyassaland in 1960.

Frank Menzies married Ruby Friend on June 22, 1922.6 The couple had two sons, David who became a dentist, and Graham who became an investor with Ian Potter & Company. Menzies was a member of the United Nations' Children's Fund and traveled to Pakistan and Rhodesia for the Fund. Frank Menzies died in Frank Menzies died in September, 1978, at the age of 86.

Description

A conservative design for the date, given its asymmetrical plan, hipped roof and overall Italianate styling, this brick house is distinguished by its unusual verandah valance (cast-iron?) which consists of a scalloped fret-like pattern of broad interlocking linear elements.

The brickwork is coloured and cemented and hood-moulds have been introduced over the arched windows in the protruding front room bay. The roof is slated and some mature exotic planting survives in the front yard.

External Integrity

The front fence has been removed (presumed timber picket).

Streetscape

A major corner contributing element in a notable late 19th early 20th century residential precinct, which adjoins Canterbury Railway Station on its south side (precinct 22).

Significance

Historically, linked with the nationally-known Menzies family, specifically Frank and Ruby Menzies, who, beyond their standing in Melbourne legal circles, were both unusually active in Third World issues, as well as representative of the life styles of the middle-classes associated with Camberwell: of State interest and regional importance.
