to a solid, but typical Edwardian ribbed brick chimney at its apex. To the north, extends a long gabled wing with terra-cotta ridging; again typical of the Edwardian era.

Burke & Schreiber's 26 Victoria Avenue is similarly composed, with its high hipped roof terminating as a surmounting attic dormer, but the verandah and resulting ornament is more extensive. Here Tudor arches augment the verandah as do the Tudoresque leaded panes the windows. Half-timbering to the gables, window bays and dormers complete the medieval allusions and provide a character slightly apart from the suburban Queen Anne.

Another unusual aspect is the mature indigenous landscape which surrounds the house, albeit augmented with some younger exotics (Oak, Liquidambar). A Lemon Scented Gum and another (Mahogany?) Gum species are all mature specimens and along with a tall Cotton Palm (?) comprise what may have been the original planting.

External Integrity

Generally original; the fence has been replaced in a sympathetic form at a less than sympathetic height.

Streetscape

Adjoins and is adjacent to other more prosaic Edwardian villas, making up for the dearth of street trees by its own landscape. The asphalt street paving and basalt kerbs complement its period.

Significance


Architecturally, an intact example of a Medieval inspired substyle to the more prevalent Queen Anne villa style which has unusual roof forms and details (peculiar to the architects Burke and Schreiber) and is sited in a mature native setting (and hence may evoke the relatively uncommon nationalistic choice of plants in Edwardian times) also it is complemented by contemporary housing and the street formation; of regional importance and State interest.

Historically, it epitomizes Camberwell's early middle class population and, as a landscape, the interest shown in private plant collections by many Camberwell residents; of local importance.

Restoration

Consider rebuilding fence as typical or original.

House, 1 Maple Crescent

History

John P O'Loughlin, probably a carpenter, was the first owner- occupier of this 5 room stuccoed brick house in 1933, suggesting a speculative owner-builder intent¹. However, it was built by R.W. Ritter for an estimated cost of £1000² and Robert Kendall was the new listed occupier after just one year³.

Description

Spanish Mission in its use of the loggia and arched parapet, this house also has the textured stucco, Cordova pattern capping tiles to the lower parapet and the shell motif above the window heads. The fence is original and the garden's character relates to the house period (hedge, cypress).

External Integrity

The brick trim to the archways has been painted.

Streetscape

The house contributes to an important residential precinct (the Golf Links Estate) providing an exotic touch among the dominant Italian villa character nearby.

Significance

Architecturally, a near intact example of a common villa style of the 1920s-30s which is distinguished by its high, arched parapet and tiled loggia also contributive to an important precinct; of regional interest and local importance.

Historically, little definite is known of O'Loughlin in the context of Camberwell.
