HISTORY

This building was erected sometime between 1920 when the land was vacant and 1928 when the directory listing is for a Salvation Army Citadel. Most of Geelong West's religous buildings were located in Pakington Street by this time and although it is not located in Pakington Street it is very near to the centre of the commercial area. It has been recently converted for use as the City of Geelong West Community Centre.

DESCRIPTION

It is a wooden building with a gabled roof. The roof is clad in corrugated iron and the walls in weatherboard. The north wall has restrained decorative elements which include a slightly projecting gable end, with simple paneling and a pressed metal soffit. Below this is the entrance which is recessed in the north wall and is accented by a modest decorative valence. On either side of the porch is a symmetrically placed window and decorative weatherboards. The windows are double hung with nine lights in the lower section and thirty-six lights in the upper section. The entrance doors also have fixed windows with extremely small lights.

SIGNIFICANCE

It was originally the Salvation Army Citadel and is now the City of Geelong West Community Centre. Built in the 1920's this building is a simple adaption of the Bungalow style so popular at that time for housing. It is of local significance.
