Pearce Park, corner Gladstone Street and Barkly Street, Golden Point.



RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that this bandstand be specified under the provisions of Clause 8 of the *Town and Country Planning Act* (Third Schedule).

BUILDING HISTORY AND ANALYSIS

This structure, possibly erected in the 1920's, is of late design when compared to other Ballarat bandstands and rotundas. It has an octagonal brick podium reached by a short flight of steps, with square timber balustrading. Plain square columns terminate in unusual timber brackets (each consisting of four small squares with a central boss) linked by a simple stylized frieze of timber. The roof, clad in terra cotta tiles, is in the form of an octagonal pyramid with a central lantern consisting of a louvered section below a small tiled turret and a rather ungainly turned timber finial.
