HISTORY

Formerly known as Anderson Street it was changed in memory of Private Edward Pizer who was killed whilst serving in the 1st AIF. The projecting front room the this house may be part of the building shown on the 1854 map. The remainder of the house and the bay window may have been an extension erected circa 1880. Alternatively the whole house may have been built about 1880.

DESCRIPTION

It is a single storey timber building clad in weatherboards and the lean-to and gable roof are clad in corrugated iron. It has a concave verandah clad in corrugated iron with siple verandah decoration in the form of wooden brackets. The finials appear to have been cut off.

SIGNIFICANCE

5 Pizer Street is a well proportioned building part of which may date from the early 1850's. It is of local significance.
