

No. 20 Hiscocks Cottage, 412-416 Learmonth Street



Allotments 1 and 3-5 of Section 1 were first purchased by Thomas Hiscock, and it is believed he resided in an early cottage on this land. Hiscock made the first gold discovery in the district on the 3rd August 1851. The early cottages have been substantially altered.

No. 22 Crown Hotel, 508 Warrenheip Street.



The original hotel enterprise on this land was carried out in a two-storied timber building constructed in c. 1852 for publican, George Selleck. The existing polychrome brick structure was built in c. 1884, after the earlier establishment was destroyed by fire. An early photograph shows a simple central porch entrance formed from a first floor balcony. The distinctive polychrome brick detailing has been painted, and removal of this paint is recommended.

No. 23. Bryden and Hedricks General Store, 322 - 26 Learmonth Street.



This important corner buildings is one of the earliest commercial buildings surviving in Buninyong, and dates from the early 1850's. The principal facade is constructed of brick with a parapet. A timber facade faces Warrenheip Street, and the structures are linked by a timber post supported verandah. A decorative timber valence completed the verandah and its reinstatement is recommended.

No. 24 Brick Shop, 306 - 8 Learmonth Street.



This brick shop is constructed with a corrugated iron roof. The building was constructed in c. 1880 and has operated as a grocery store continuously from the 1890s. The building has been substantially altered to incorporate new additions.
