HISTORY: Probably built in the 1860s-70s.

<u>VISUAL DESCRIPTION</u>: A Victorian timber shop and residence. The skillion-roofed front has a parapet: the left bay set forward as a shop, the right bay is the residence with a verandah in the angle. Behind are two additions with gable across.

<u>COMPARATIVE ANALYSIS</u>: Comparable to: 11 James Street. About 16 good early timber houses have been identified in Richmond.

<u>SIGNIFICANCE</u>: A Victorian shop and residence of a type rare in Richmond. Of historical interest at local level.

<u>INTACTNESS</u>: Much altered. The verandah is removed and an inappropriate metal canopy added. The gable sections are brick clad.

CONDITION & THREATS: Neglect.
