HISTORY: Built probably about 1875.

<u>VISUAL DESCRIPTION</u>: A characteristic, double-fronted, timber, symmetrical, Italianate house, set back. The verandah has cast-iron lace and brackets. The unusual eaves brackets are ogee timber. It has a timber picket fence and gate.

<u>COMPARATIVE ANALYSIS</u>: Comparable to 21 Mary Street (ref: 8); 7 Palmer Street (ref: 54); 41 Shelley Street (ref: 103) and 1-5 Pearson Street (ref: 160).

<u>SIGNIFICANCE</u>: A characteristic, double-fronted, timber, symmetrical, Italianate house, of local architectural interest.

<u>INTACTNESS</u>: Fair. The entire verandah has been rebuilt and partly replaced. The chimney has been painted. The hedge has been removed. Lattice has been applied to the side wall.

CONDITION & THREATS: Good.
