Description:

A single storey Victorian symmetrical villa of tuck pointed (overpainted) brick with a cement rendered base, aedicules and corner pilasters. There is a timber frieze under the eaves, and two cement rendered chimneys. The front door has sidelights and toplight with some original coloured glass.

Condition:

Good

Integrity:

Fair. The original verandah has been removed and the roof has been re-lined with terra cotta tiles.

History:

In 1870, A. Howgate commenced building a house in Little Charles Street on the south-west corner with Langridge Street. The house was completed by 1871 and was described as brick. Howgate, a publican, resided there.

Howgate continued as owner, leasing the property to several tenants from 1875. By 1879 Abraham Howgate resumed residence, although from 1880 he leased the property to Joseph Howgate, a barman, for several years. By 1891 A. Howgate was living there and he continued to do so in 1900. (RB 1870, 1871, 1875, 1879, 1880, 1891, 1901)

A typical no longer intact villa of its period.
