Description:

A two storey cement rendered brick building with unusual rusticated treatment. The ground floor openings are arched and the first floor windows are flat-topped with bracketted cornices over. The plainly detailed parapet was formerly surmounted by urns.

History:

In 1872, John Falvey owned enclosed land on the north-west corner of Victoria and Lithgow Streets, on which he built a "house" in 1873. John Davis, a publican, was tenant. In 1874 the property was listed as the "East Collingwood Hotel". Falvey continued as owner until 1877 when Maria Falvey took over ownership. Falvey did not operate the hotel herself, but leased it to a series of tenants. She continued as owner in 1891. By 1900, J. Pearce had purchased the property with Mary Donoho the licensed victualler. (RB 1872, 1873, 1874, 1877, 1891, 1901) In 1912 the name was changed to the "Crown"

Significance:

A prominent and early public building with unusual facade enrichment and of historic interest as a former hotel.
