In 1872 William Keppell purchased land on whe built a wood house in the same year. house was rented to Thomas Martin, a furrice (1872, RB). In 1874 Keppell owned the houses on this site leaving a fourth be vacant, (1873, 1874, RB). In 1876 the house were described as brick, (1874, 1876, RB). In 1878, a fourth brick house was built, No. in which Keppell, a packer, resided, (1878). Keppell continued as landlord until when Edward Edgerton, a carpenter, purchable properties. By 1887 Keppell be repurchased the properties and continued to them in 1900, (1884, 1887, 1901, RB).

N.B. The 1874 RB entry (the first to rectified houses on Keppell's land), presume refers to three new houses and not two houselus one earlier wooden house).

Significance:

Nos 41-47 form a prominent terrace in Lithg Street and are substantially intact. They typical of their period.
