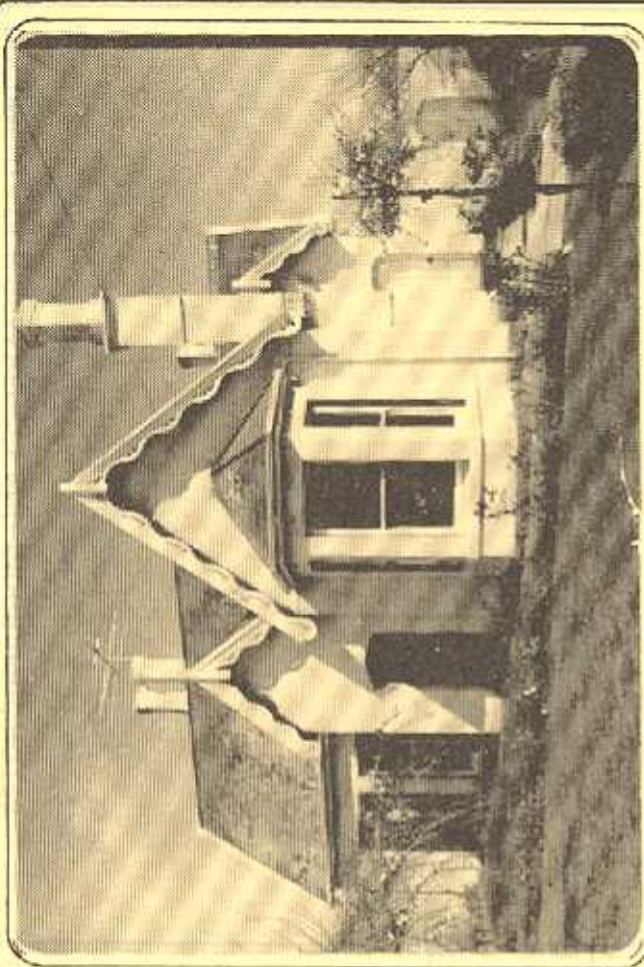

CITATION The stucco rendered brick house with bluestone basement at 116 Tanner Street, Breakwater, was constructed in 1869/70 for Geelong tannery proprietor, F. Haworth. This 9 room house, which was built as a picturesque gothic villa, in a style popularised by architectural pattern books of the mid 19th century, was designed by Geelong architect, William Grundy and is a notable example of his work. The former Haworth residence, was one of a number of substantial villas erected by the proprietors of the fellmongeries and tanneries established in the 1860s in the area.
