

DOCUMENTATION REFERENCES AND BIOGRAPHIC NOTES

The history of construction of this building, erected by Geelong Architects Davidson and Henderson as their own residence is comprehensively recorded in Allan Willingham 'Two Scots in Victoria: The Architecture of Davidson and Henderson' Master of Architecture thesis University of Melbourne, 1983, pg126-130 including contemporary descriptions and Sketch plan of the residence, photograph of the building upon completion, and reference to later extensions in 1874.

Geelong Advertiser 14 December 1872 for details of cavity brick used in construction of the brick walls of the residence.

The bricks were manufactured by T.H. Widdicomb of Portarlington.

CITATION
This two storey polychromatic brick residence on Western Beach was designed and built by Davidson and Henderson, Geelong Architects as their own accommodation. The design is less exotic than other homes built and public buildings in their French Renaissance mode, and is most notable for the use of hollow brick or cavity walls construction. This technique improved construction standards and this house is one of the earliest recorded examples of hollow wall construction in Australia and is of technological interest. The villa was one of the first buildings on Western Beach, and set a fashionable standard when completed in 1874.
