

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



BUILDING CITATION

The two storey townhouse, 'Lime's Grove', at 265 Pigdon Street, was erected in 1891 for William Hearnden. The two storey rendered brick structure has a two storey cast iron verandah with centrally located pediment. There is a deep elaborate cornice and balustrade with pedimented name plate. The outbuildings remain in an almost original condition.

This is an exceptionally fine example of boom style terrace architecture. The typical composition by superb boom classical decoration. The elaborate cornice and parapet, the lionshead medallions, and pedimented verandah are particularly notable. The unpainted facades are of considerable merit. It is a prominent feature of the North Carlton precinct and a fine example of a building type which is a distinctive feature of inner suburban Melbourne.

The cast iron palisade fence is compatible with the house.
