The site at 1 Flinders Parade originally formed of the land owned by Alexander Cameron MacDonald from 28 January, 1865. ¹ MacDonald's landholdings were sold to John Middlemiss is 1870, before Frederick Challis purchased it on 13 January, 1876. ^{1,2} Chall owned the land until it was subdivided by the Barwon Heads Estate Company Limited in 1890-91, when this corner allotment (known a part lot 31) was sold to A. Miller. ³ By 1901, the allotment was owned by G.F. Holden, ⁴ but he sold it to George Golightly between 190 1912. ⁵ Golightly appears to have had this shop built in 1934-35, ⁶ at a time when Barwon Heads had undergone a number of improvements, including the erection of the Lobster Pot Dance Hall in the Barwon Heads Park, and the Public Hall in Hitchcock Avenu and the reconstruction of the Mt Colite Hotel. ⁷ These developments were obviously brought about by the town being a popular holidar resort at this time.
