Physical Description of Site:

The site has several mature exotic and fruit trees, a cypress windrow, and an underground well. The building was developed in at least four stages.

The earliest section is a small brick and stone cottage, with a steep pitch gable root clad in corrugated iron. The west elevation is constructed from sandstone with red bricks above ceiling level, with a stone inscription plaque proclaiming "Allens Week 1856". The cottage has new 12 pane windows, french doors, a small verandah added to the south elevation and a new bricks on the east elevation. The next section was an extension to the north side of the cottage, in red brick and sandstone, with a hipped and gable roof, clad in corrugated iron, There is a simple verandah on the north elevation.

A separate weatherboard clad section has an internal red brick chimney and a hipped roof, clad in new corrugated iron. It is probably the detached kitchen for the original cottage, but is now joined to the other building by a new walkway.

Henry Brinsmead is listed in the 1916 Bellarine Rate Book as a Farmer at Leopold with a house and land, and Henry Brinsmead, son of William, was born in 1856, and was a resident at "Allens Creek", Leopold.(5) (6)

A written account by Henry Brinsmead's grandchild recalls stables, barns, cowyards, a milk separator room and a blacksmiths shop on the property, and the house encircled by a white picket fence and an acre of gardens and lawns. (1)

In 1952 Mr John Jackson purchased "Ashgarth" in Ashgarth Ave, the original Brinsmeads pioneer farm. It was 200 acres on Lake Connewarre - at first a dairy farm, then producing peas and potatoes. (7.)

The property was advertised for sale in The Geelong Advertiser Sat 31st Dec1983 as "Brinsmeads", on Lake Connewarre, built c1866.
