Foundation stone for present school buildings laid 11.12.1911. The architects were Shaw & Dowden. Tenders were called 30.4.1856 by ~~Shaw & Dowden~~ ¹⁸⁵⁶

Archives p 215 - 1912, a chapel was built at the school to be used for the religious services of the parish. It was built at a cost of £1,200.

* Designed by Kennedy and Stevin. The foundation stone was laid on 10 Dec. 1911.

DESCRIPTION PLEASE

The front of the school faces the playing fields rather than the road, and is composed ~~symmetrically~~ ^{asymetrically} with an axial plan. The central bay window has ~~concrete~~ ^{render} symbolic cross. ~~The~~ ^{The} hipped roof is surmounted by rows of ~~decorative~~ ^{terracotta} capped ventilators and by simple brick chimneys. ~~Corner~~ ^{gables} windows project from the ends of the hipped roofs. ~~They~~ ^{They} are three sided. The red brick structure has a minimum of decoration apart from some cream brick arches over window openings. ~~It is a~~ ^{It is a} restrained and austere building ~~of great interest by~~ ^{compared with the flamboyant decorative of the period} the intersection of its many hipped roofs.
