BUILT: 1921

HISTORY - This was designed for dentist, R.M. Gillies and is claimed to be the first in Victoria, designed specifically for a dental practice. His son, R. Ian Gillies, practises there today.

Built on the Kinkora Estate, subdivided after Patrick O'Brien's death and the extension of the railway in the 1880s, the accessability to dentistry was enhanced more recently by the tramline taken past this block in 1913.

DESCRIPTION - A fluent elevation in stuccoed brick of one-level and possessing unusual perforated cap-shape parapets over two symmetrically disposed, panelled and semi-circular window bays. Between is placed an arched portal with pronounced voussoirs and associated smooth rustication. Above, as counterpoint, is a swagged arch performation to the otherwise blank parapet panel. Timber framed windows are given typical long casements with square toplights and glazed with clear leaded panes. This is a boldly formed design with some of the plasticity of form seen in the Neo-Baroque banks and R.S.L. Club, also in Glenferrie Road, but little of their eclecticism in detail.

INTEGRITY - Generally original

STREFTSCAPE - Relates to arched shapes in (773-79).

SIGNIFICANCE - Architecturally: an intact, boldly massed and successful commercial design which possesses uncommon details (perforated parapet) and is enhanced by shops adjoining (773-79): of high regional importance.

Fistorically: claimed to be the first custom-built dental surgery in Victoria and perhaps the first commercial built-form to house medical services in the study area: of regional significance. (Note: a dentist's surgery exists at 14-16 Gertrude Street, built in 1912). ENHANCEMENT - Repaint in typical or original colours.
