## 34 HAWTHORN GROVE

## History

This house may have been constructed by the local builder, J. Kaiser, in 1896 for T. Wallace, draper. Edwin Barratt, a civil servant, was its owner from 1901 until the 1950s. It was the home of J. Davies, a medical specialist, in 1930. By the late 1970s, No. 34 was being let as apartments. Other Hawthorn Grove villas built in 1896 by Kaiser were Nos. 25, 27, 42, 44 and 46.51

## Significance

This 1896 house constructed for T. Wallace, draper, may be an example of the work of the local builder, J. Kaiser, who built at least five houses in Hawthorn Grove in that year. No. 34 has historical significance as an example of the comfortable villas in garden setttings constructed by local builders in the middle and late 1890s for local business and professional men and their families in middle-class suburban Hawthorn.
