### 16 YARRA STREET

"ZETLAND"

### History

The following research by Carlotta Kellaway is taken from the National Trust file 2396.

According to the Borough of Hawthorn rate books Charles Black's house, later known as "Zetland", 16 Yarra Street, Hawthorn was built between 1873 and 1874. It was valued at 25 pounds<sup>12</sup> and the following year as one valued at 60 pounds.<sup>13</sup> It is located in St. James Park in a subdivision of J.F. Palmer's "Burwood" made in 1871 by George Coppin.<sup>14</sup>

From 1876 until the turn of the century "Zetland" was owned by the Robertson family. In 1876/77 John Robertson, accountant, is listed as owner/occupier of a house in Yarra Street valued at 65 pounds. By the late 1880s the building is owned/occupied by John Robertson, tailor, and described as a brick house of twelve rooms in Yarra Street NAV 95 pounds. In John Robertson, merchant, is owner/occupier in 1889/90, when No. 16 is described as a brick house of eight rooms. Py 1891/92 John Robertson, tailor, is owner/occupier of a brick house of ten rooms in Yarra Street w. side NAV 96 pounds. By the late 1890s the building is identified as "Zetland" at 16 Yarra Street, is listed still as a brick house of ten rooms, owned by John Robertson, tailor, and occupied by John W. Robertson, barrister, NAV 66 pounds.

An MMBW plan dated 1901, when "Zetland" is owned still by the Robertson family, shows the 1870s building facing Yarra Street with its front verandah and steps leading to an asphalt path with garden on each side. At the rear of the building there is a pitched area with a manure pit and large stables near the back right-of-way.<sup>20</sup>

#### 16 Yarra Street continued

A change in ownership is recorded in the Hawthorn rate books in 1914/15 when Mary Dowling is owner/occupier of 16 Yarra Street, a brick house of ten rooms NAV 66 pounds. In 1929/30 Edward Pincott, tallow broker, becomes owner/occupier. The owner by the early 1930s is Dr. Bryan O'Day. 23
