# **INTER-WAR HOUSE**

# The Site

The site of 462 Glenferrie Road on the east side of Glenferrie Road between Wellesley and Gardiner Roads, opposite Scotch College, remained undeveloped until the First World War years. A pre-World War I Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works drainage plan shows only tracks on the block, bounded on its east side by Berkeley Road. There are only two small houses in the vicinity, on the block to the north, up to Callantina Road, and the present Scotch College site is occupied by the early residence Hawthorn Glen.<sup>1</sup>

This area of Hawthorn gradually developed, particularly during the inter-war period. It became a prestigious residential section of Glenferrie Road with substantial brick buildings constructed mainly in the 1920s and 1930s, including two flats buildings. This development illustrates the inter-war prosperity of parts of Hawthorn.

# History of 462 Glenferrie Road

An eight-roomed brick house was rated on the site of 462 Glenferrie Road for the first time in the 1928-29 Power Ward records. It was owned and occupied by John Marmaduke Ashworth, civil servant.<sup>2</sup> On the eve of the Great Depression, the house had the substantial NAV of 180 pounds.<sup>3</sup>

Ashworth's house stood next to a five-roomed brick house owned by Ernest Dixon and occupied by Ernest Wood, civil servant, with the much lesser valuation of 90 pounds.<sup>4</sup> This was the site later of a block of flats. On the other side of Ashworth was the brick All Saints Church and Hall,<sup>5</sup> built c1916.<sup>6</sup>

The valuation of Ashworth's residence declined slightly during the 1930s depression years. In 1929-30, its valuation was down to 170 pounds<sup>7</sup> and in 1930-31 to 155 pounds.<sup>8</sup> By 1932-33, it was listed in the rate records as 437 Glenferrie Road and had an NAV of 145 pounds.<sup>9</sup> By the late 1930s, Ashworth's address was given in Sands and McDougall **Victorian Directories** as 453 Glenferrie Road.

The Ashworth family continued to be associated with the property at least until the late 1950s.<sup>10</sup>

# Alterations and Additions

Rate book and directory evidence confirms that alterations and additions were made to the property in the 1940s when it was converted into two flats. J.M. Ashworth, who had retired by this time, lived in Flat 1, seven rooms with an NAV of 90 pounds. Frederick Raymond Gamble, manufacturer, lived in Flat 2 of five rooms, also with a valuation of 90 pounds. Evelyn M. Ashworth was rated as the owner of 453 Glenferrie Road.<sup>11</sup> During these years and later, the Ashworth property was listed in the Victorian Directories as Penrith Flats. Ashworth still occupied Flat 1 in the late 1940s, while T.A. Pettigrew, Manager, occupied Flat 2.<sup>12</sup>

By the 1960s, the Ashworth property had changed its numbering to the present 462 Glenferrie Road.<sup>13</sup>

City of Boroondara Building Department records describe the property now as a 10-roomed house. Additions and alterations are listed as a sleepout in 1945; alterations to the dwelling and construction of brick front fencing in 1976 at a cost of \$10,000; a carport in 1977; a swimming pool in 1982; and more alterations in 1990.<sup>14</sup>

# Architect/Builder

Despite a search of the Australian Architectural Index and files of the Hawthorn Standard and Argus, held at the State Library of Victoria, no information has been found concerning a possible builder or designer of the brick residence at 462 Glenferrie Road. A search of MMBW Drainage Plans also proved unfruitful, although a 1934 drainage plan was found for the flats at 468 Glenferrie Road, with the name of a possible designer and/or builder, during the 1992 Hawthorn Heritage Study.

### Heritage Value

No. 462 Glenferrie Road was identified in the recent **Hawthorn Heritage Study** as one of a group of properties, mainly dating from the inter-war period, with local significance as illustrations of the prestigious nature of development in this section of Glenferrie Road opposite Scotch College. Other members of the group included the Kennon Memorial Hall at 464 Glenferrie Road, associated with the adjacent All Saints Church, described as in good condition and of good integrity, with an original landscape layout. All Saints Church at No. 466, comprised a c1916 church, hall and landscaped grounds. The 1934 Wellesley Flats, on the corner of Wellesley road, was described as significant as "one of a group of flats buildings constructed as investments near Scotch College in a prestigious section of Glenferrie Road". Study found that these flats "illustrate the early years of high quality flat construction which continued up to World War 2".<sup>15</sup>

No. 462 was described as an example of inter-war housing in good condition and of good integrity.

# Statement of Significance

The ten-roomed late 1920s brick residence at 462 Glenferrie Road, owned and occupied by the Ashworth family over a long period, has local significance as one of a group of mainly inter-war properties, all in good condition and of good integrity, constructed in this prestigious section of Glenferrie Road opposite Scotch College. The group illustrates Hawthorn's prosperity during the inter-war years.

# Recommendation

That any future work on this property should be of a sympathetic nature, compatible with the heritage value of No. 462 as part of a group of mainly inter-war buildings in the vicinity of Scotch College, and as a component of a significant streetscape in one of Hawthorn's most prestigious residential areas.
