## 518 GLENFERRIE ROAD

### History

Mrs. Elizabeth Mollison was the first owner/occupier in 1887-88 of the substantial double-storeyed brick residence in a garden setting known now as 518 Glenferrie Road.<sup>36</sup> The property was described the following year as an eleven-roomed brick house, still owned by Mrs. Mollison.<sup>37</sup> By 1893, No. 197 Glenferrie Road (as the property was then known) was the home of Alexander Gillespie, gentleman, and was listed as a nine-roomed brick house.<sup>38</sup>
