<u>Description</u>	Formed from two separate buildings, the Oxford Street facade has a north section with two storeys plus semi basement, with 4 bays and is symmetrical about a raised parapetted section (Foy & Gibson Pty. Ltd.). The south section is also symmetrical in a similar manner, but has 6 bays to Oxford Street with 2 levels plus basement. The facade windows throughout are recent, the buildings conforming in other respects with standard Foy and Gibson details.
<u>Condition</u>	Good
<u>Integrity</u>	Fair, "The Pratt Group" entry is intrusive.
<u>History</u>	Built on the site of houses these buildings were commenced in 1906 (1907 RB) and completed by 1908 (1909RB).
<u>Significance</u>	The former F & G offices for Woollen Mills at 150-154 Oxford Street form an integral part of the Oxford Street streetscape and are important also for their probable link with William Pitt, architect and City of Collingwood councillor.
<u>Recommendations</u>	Recommended for inclusion on the National Estate Register and for Planning Scheme protection.
