

BUILDER: The origin of this prefabricated cottage is not known, but it may be one of a large number imported to Geelong by Merchant, Frederick Bauer in 1853 and 1854.



SUBSEQUENT SIGNIFICANT OWNERS/OCCUPANTS The building remained in the ownership of the Webster family from 1870-1916.

CITATION

The prefabricated 4-room weatherboard clad cottage at 22 Coronation Street is one of a number of portable buildings imported to Geelong in the period 1853-1856 to meet accommodation exigencies during the Victorian gold rushes. The picturesque style cottage was most probably imported by Frederick Bauer, a Geelong entrepreneur and portable house merchant from Hamburg. The construction system is of great technological interest and the cottage is one of a building type best represented in Geelong. The prefabricated cottage dates from 1854 and has strong historical links with the early development of Geelong.

SIGNIFICANCE OF PLACE
