Description				
<p>The Jessie McKechnie Memorial Gates plaque is situated on a brick pier, with a tapered concrete capping. The pier is approximately 1500mm high. The steel memorial gates have been removed from the piers and are stored in a shed on the school site.</p>				
History				
<p>The Jessie McKechnie Memorial gates were erected in 1960, as a memorial to Miss Jessie McKechnie, a most valued and long-serving teacher of the Barwon Heads Primary School.^{1,2,3} As a teacher, Miss McKechnie had devoted almost 23 years of her teaching life to the Barwon Heads school.³ She taught at the old school on the outskirts of the town, at the Cray Pot in the Barwon Heads Park, and at its current location. Miss McKechnie died in front of her class, which was a great shock to the community as she had not experienced any previous signs of illness.³ Only six months before her death, Miss McKechnie had purchased a property at 20 Ozone Road, which was one of the former Boat Sheds from the Barwon River foreshore (see separate Record Sheet).³</p>

Statement of Cultural Significance <p>The Jessie McKechnie Memorial Gates and plaque are <i>historically</i> significant at a LOCAL level. It is associated with Miss Jessie McKechnie, a former valued and long-serving school teacher of the Barwon Heads Primary School.</p> <p>The Jessie McKechnie Memorial Gates and plaque are <i>socially</i> significant at a LOCAL level. They are recognised and valued by the school community, as a memorial to the long-serving school teacher of the Barwon Heads Primary School, Miss Jessie McKechnie.</p> <p>Overall, the Jessie McKechnie Memorial Gates and plaque at 3A Golf Links Road are of LOCAL significance.</p> <p>Recommendation: It is recommended that the memorial gates be returned to the gate piers at the front of the school. If for safety and/or practical reasons the gates cannot be re-installed, then they should be re-located within the school grounds, and identified as the Jessie McKechnie Memorial gates (the plaque should accompany the gates).</p>
