Statement of Significance

20 Barry Street is a two storey late Victorian villa which appears to have undergone extensive alterations in the Interwar period. While it retains some leadlight, its original roof and chimneys and some original door and window joinery, the front verandah and balcony have been completely built in with solid brick walls. The garden retains some significant elements of the original with some intrusions, but is largely obscured by an inappropriate high fence.
