Comment Additions to front detract

Statement of Significance

1 Fernhurst Grove is of significance as a distinguished example of the Federation Domestic Queen Anne Revival. Notable features include the verandah, door and window joinery, Marseilles tile roof, terracotta ridge tiles and finials and brick chimneys. Shingles to attic windows and the half timbering of gables is also intact and integral to the building's significance.

Comments

An addition to the front and the enclosure of part of the verandah are detrimental to the building's integrity and appearance. The fence is also inappropriate.
