Statement of Significance

Weatherville, 103 Wellington Street, is a distinctive, significantly intact example of a turn of the century single storey villa. Contributive elements include the the distinctive decorative iron of the verandah, the slate roof, with its iron finials, antifixae and chimneys, the leadlight and joinery of windows and doors and the timber trusses of the gables. The walls are of red brick with decorative courses of brown brick.

Comments

The garden, which is somewhat overgrown, appears to retain some original plants. The front fence may be original, but is more likely to be a fairly recent addition.
