Statement of Significance

Walden, 105 Sackville Street, is a distinctive and significant example of late Federation domestic design, showing the influence of the American Shingle Style and Craftsman Bungalow in its attic storey balcony and the porch below. Other contributive elements include the door and window joinery, leadlight, the red brick walls, Marseilles tile roof with finials and the chimneys. The grounds, including the driveway, pergola, front hedge and fence, are also integral to the site's significance and make an important contribution to the Sackville Street streetscape.
