Statement of Significance

The house at 111 Sackville Street is a large and distinctive Federation bungalow. Contributive elements include the arched porch with its heavily buttressed corners, the red brick walls, shingles in the gables and the unusually tall, slender chimneys. The tiles of the roof are of unglazed terracotta, and the garden appears to retain many of its original trees.
