Statement of Significance

14 Fernhurst Grove is a distinctive and relatively intact attic storeyed Federation villa. Notable features include the slate roof, terracotta ridge tiles and finials, unusual verandah and fine leadlight. The timber joinery and brick chimneys also appear intact.
