Statement of Significance

Rohese, 15 Barry Street, is a two storey late Victorian villa retaining many original elements including its slate roof, brick chimneys, brick walls, window and door joinery and a verandah on the north side. The house has an unusually untidy massing which suggests that it has been added to at various stages. The garden contains a number of well established trees which contribute to the significance of the site.

Comments

The brick walls, now painted, were possibly polychrome originally and may have been painted to hide variations in brick colours after additions were made. The house is obscured by a high fence.
