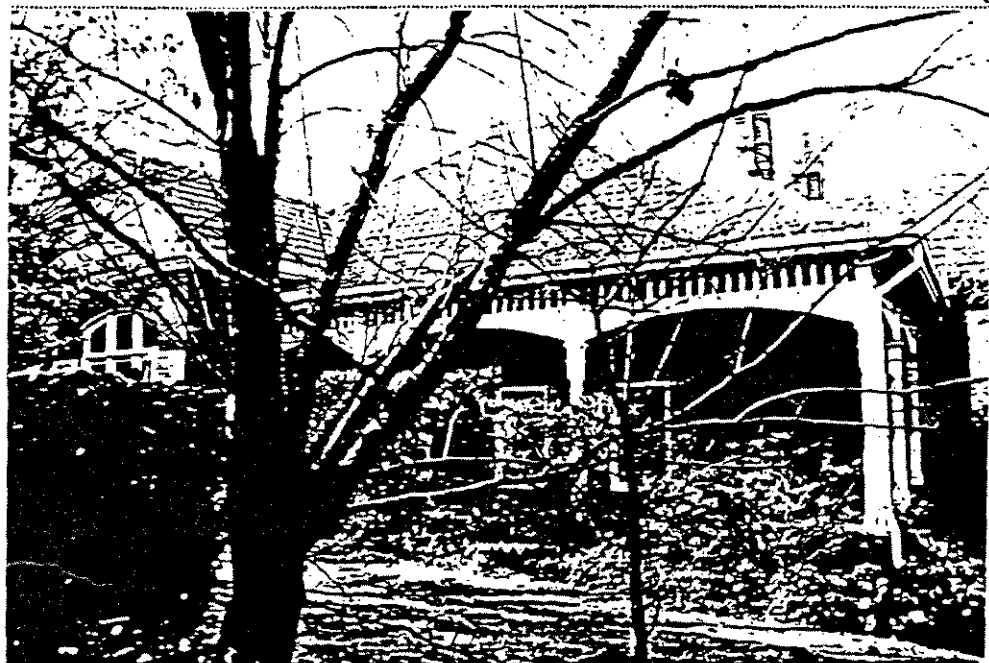

Statement of Significance

16 Fernhurst Grove is a notable single storey example of the Federation Domestic Queen Anne Revival. Elements integral to its significance include leadlights and timber joinery, the timber verandah and the tiled roof with terracotta ridge tiles and finials and brick chimneys. The front fence, gate and hedge are also likely to be original.

Comments

The shutters of the front windows are likely to be later additions.
