Statement of Significance

The house at 2 Doona Avenue is a small and essentially intact (externally) single storey timber cottage, a fine example of a common house type of the late Victorian period. The timber of the facade emulates dressed stone, and the joinery of windows and doors and the front verandah remain unaltered. The chimney is unpainted and intact. The front fence is an Edwardian or interwar addition and is composed of crimped wire and a cyclone gate.
