Comment

The house at 22 Barrington Avenue is a fine and significantly intact example of the Federation Domestic Queen Anne Revival. Notable elements include the timber verandah, leadlights, original door and window joinery, and the Marseilles tiles, ridge tiles, finials and chimneys of the roof. The short square tower with pyramidal roof on the north side is also distinctive and adds to the theme of asymmetry typical of the style.
