Statement of Significance

22 Walmer Street is significant as a large and elegant example of late Victorian Italianate design. Relatively intact externally, it retains its original cast iron verandah, slate roof, iron finials and chimneys. The joinery of windows and doors appears original and intact. Rendered surfaces have been painted but are an appropriate colour. The fence is distinctive and quite early in date and the garden retains vestiges of original planting.
