Statement of Significance

23 Barry Street is a distinctive example of the Federation Domestic Queen Anne Revival. Significantly intact, it retains its timber verandah, roofed in corrugated iron, the joinery of windows and doors and the Marseilles tiles, terracotta ridge tiles and finials and brick chimneys of the roof. The garden appears to retain some original plants and its original layout.
