Statement of Significance

27 Barry Street combines the typical plan and composition of the standard two storey late Victorian villa with the detailing and materials of the Federation period, suggesting that it was built late in the nineteenth century. Relatively intact, features integral to its significance include leadlight, window and door joinery, the timber verandah and balcony and the slates, terracotta ridge tiles and finials and brick chimneys of the roof.
