

Statement of Significance

St Clair is a fine and distinctive example of of what might be termed Federation Filigree, the transition from late Victorian Italianate to the Federation domestic styles. A two storey villa, it exhibits the decorative timber verandah, balcony and gable ornament that typify the style, here utilising an unusual variety of patterns. Other elements integral to the building's significance include slate tiles, broad chimneys with strapwork, face brickwork and door and window joinery.
