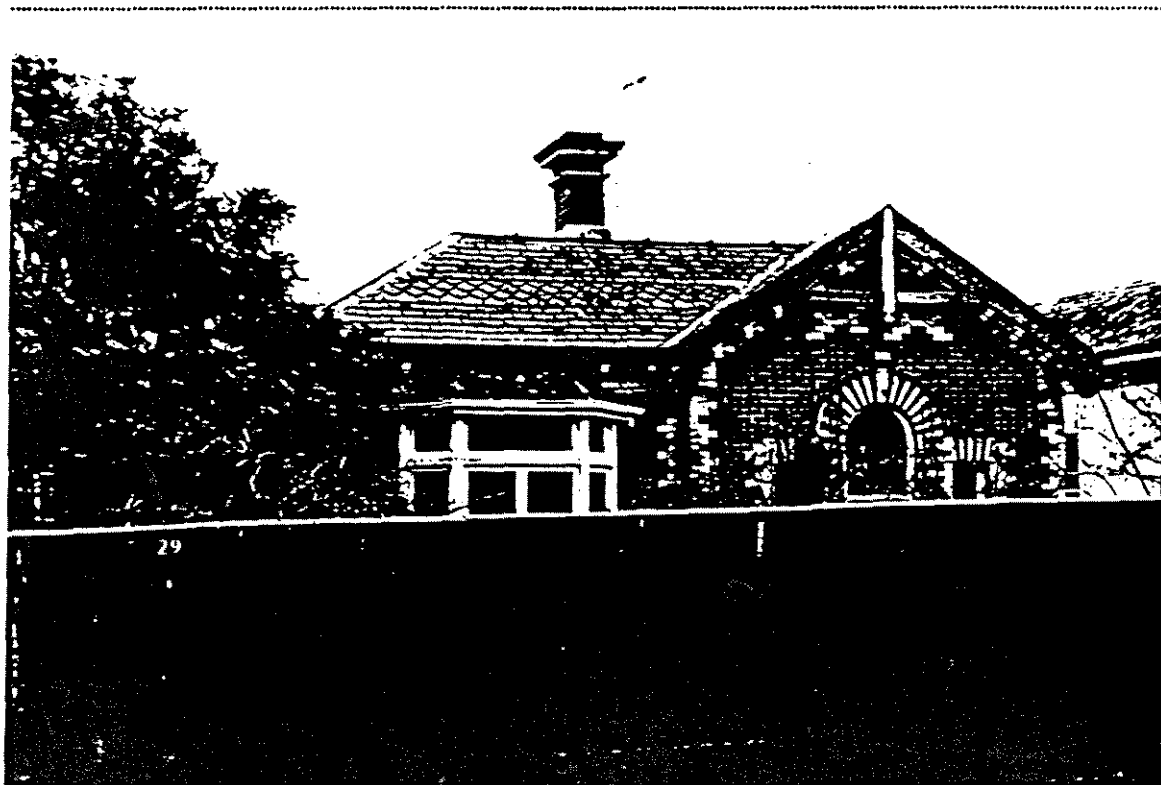

Statement of Significance

The house at 29 Wrixon Street is a fine and representative example of a late Victorian single storey polychrome villa. Contributive elements include the slate roof and brick chimneys, brick walls, bay window, verandah and cast iron decoration and the gable truss and finial. Door and window joinery, including leadlight, appears largely intact, however the house is largely obscured from the street by a high and inappropriate fence
