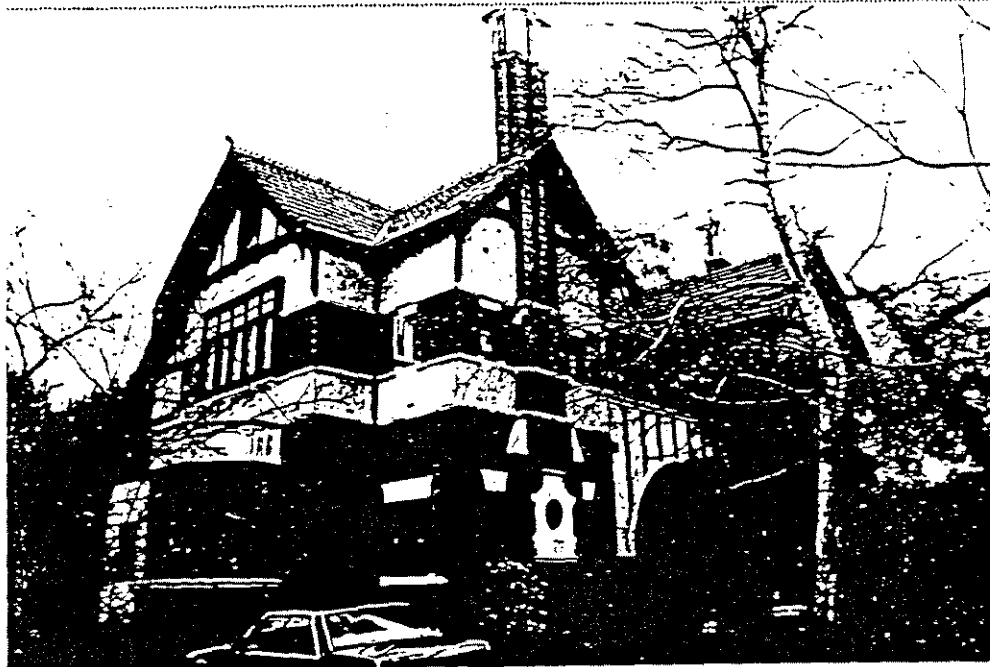

Statement of Significance

Built 1907-8 for Jabez L Carnegie, Mayor of Kew, 14 Cameron Court is of significance for its historical associations and as a large and relatively intact example of the Freestyle. Notable elements include the large brick chimneys, which are treated freely at their bases, the 'blood and bone' banding of the arched entrance porch, the unusual square tower with undulating parapet on the north side and the terracotta tiles, ridge tiles and finials of the roof.
