Statement of Significance

4 Selbourne Road, \_\_\_\_\_, is an unusual but somewhat altered example of a double storey, single fronted late Victorian polychrome house. The brickwork retains much of its original tuckpointing, and other original elements include the slate roof and the joinery to windows and doors. The chimneys have been somewhat modified, and Interwar and Postwar additions have been made to the rear and south of the building.

Comments

The stairs to the first floor on the north side of the building are inappropriate and obtrusive.
