A late Victorian two storey red brick house with cream brick dressings, 46-48 Adeney Avenue is Italianate in style, with brackets under the eaves and a combination of flat and arched windows. Integral to its style and significance are the tuckpointing of the bricks, leadlights, original timber joinery, the slate roof and chimneys. The verandah around the ground floor of the south west corner appears original, as do the barge boards and timber trusses and finials of the gables.

Comments

It is possible that the verandah has been reconstructed - close inspection is necessary to determine this. A high and inappropriate fence obscures the view of the house.
