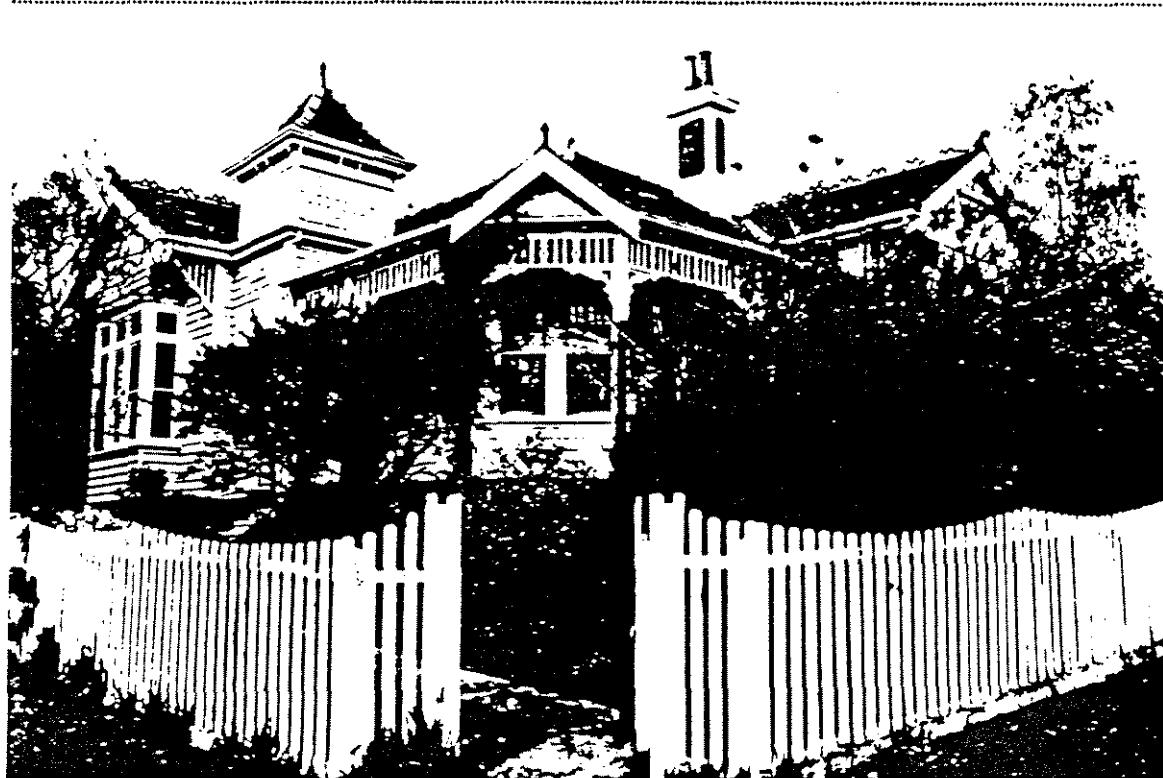

Statement of Significance

58 Kent Street is significant as a representative and largely intact example of the single storey timber Federation villa. Notable elements include the weatherboards, notched in imitation of shingles, the small tower with pyramidal roof, the timber verandah and its frieze and the slate roof, with its terracotta ridge tiles and finials and brick chimneys decorated with strapwork. Also relatively intact is the joinery of windows and doors, including leadlight, the garden
