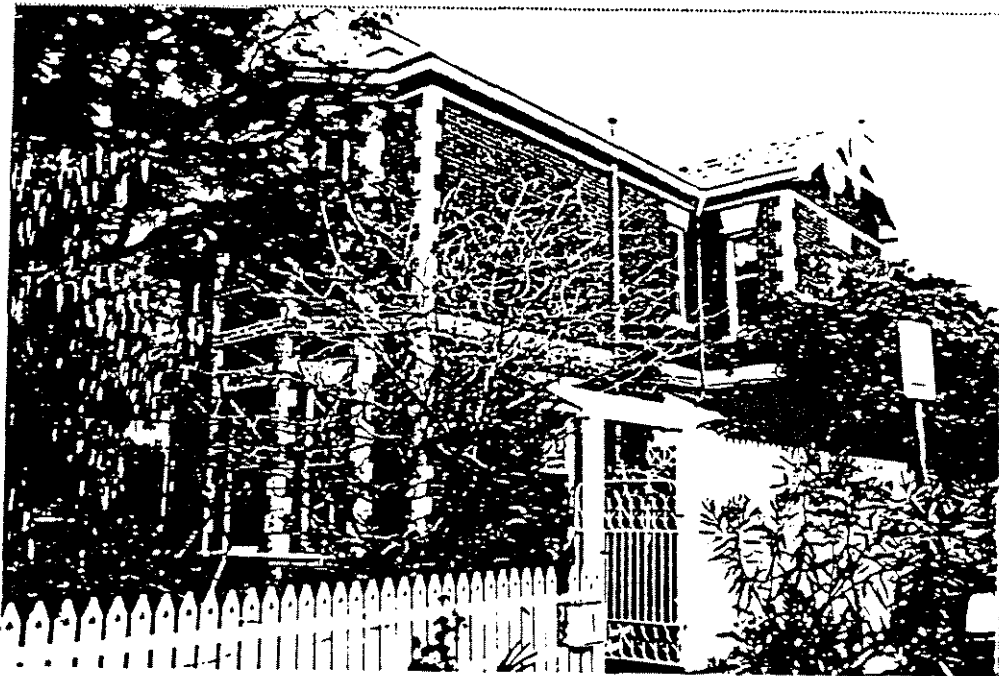

Statement of Significance

The house at 6 Doona Avenue is a distinctive example of late Victorian domestic design, with walls of red brick and stucco dressing such as quoins at the corners. This two storey house is significantly intact on the exterior, and retains an unusual combination of timber gable trusses, a timber porch and cast iron verandah. Timber and leadlight joinery, the slate roof and the chimneys are relatively intact and contributory to the significance of the whole.
