Statement of Significance

7 Fellows Street is of significance as a notable example of the Federation attic storeyed villa. Although some details have been lost, particularly in terms of the windows, it retains significant elements such as leadlight, half-timbering in gables, shingling around the attic storey, large turned timber brackets under the eaves of gables and Marseilles tiles.
