Statement of Significance

These houses are a notable example of a two storey Victorian Italianate terrace and remain significantly intact. The render of the walls has been ruled to imitate ashlar, and the parapet is richly decorated. The cast iron to both floors remains intact. Most original joinery remains, though some windows have been changed, and the roof and chimneys are original and in apparently good condition. The terrace is an important contributory element in the important Glenferrie Road streetscape.
