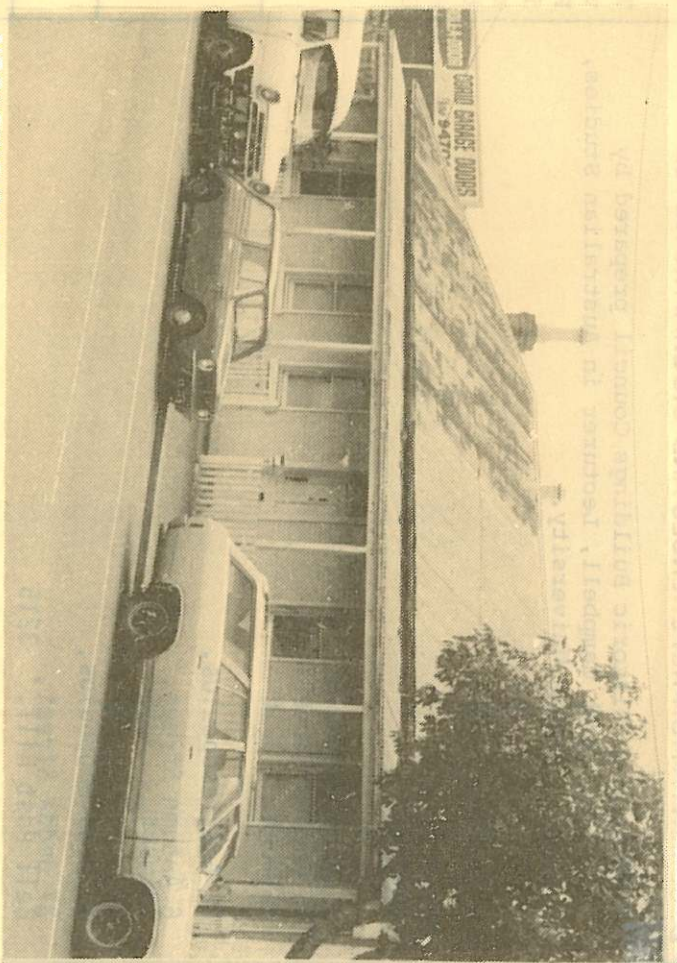

CITATION

The former Harp Inn was an important public house from a very early era located strategically on the Old Melbourne Road opposite the adjoining Sale Yards and stockyards. It is an unpretentious solid brick building with double hipped roof. Some Morewood & Rogers roof tiles remain, however, the integrity of the building has been decreased by the alteration to the windows. An important early hotel in Geelong.
